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1. BACKGROUND RESEARCH

1.1. INTRODUCTION

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The literature review focuses on the proposed E. Main Street COTA BRT project and its immediate vicinity to identify known or potentially undocumented cultural resources that may be within its APE. The Literature Review Study Area is the Limits of Disturbance (LOD on attached mapping) plus a buffer of the adjoining modern parcels (Figures 1–3). This buffer is employed to fully encapsulate whatever is finally established as the APE. That APE would incorporate any minor alterations to the Construction Limits (LOD) as the process progresses and would include any potentially undocumented cultural resources that may be within its APE. The report author examined the following sources from the Ohio State Historic Preservation Office (OHPO), the State Library of Ohio, and various online resources:

1. Mills' (1914) Archaeological Atlas of Ohio
2. OHPO database
3. Ohio Archaeological Inventory (OAI) forms
4. Contract Cultural Resource Management reports
5. Ohio Historic Inventory (OHI) forms
6. National Historic Landmark listings
7. NRHP files, nomination form files, and Determination of Eligibility (DOE) files
8. Ohio Historic Bridge Inventory forms
9. Ohio Genealogical Society (OGS) Cemeteries
10. USGS 7.5' and 15' series topographic maps, historical aerial photographs, and Franklin and Licking County historic atlases

2.1. ARCHAEOLOGICAL RESOURCES

The Archaeological Atlas of Ohio (Mills 1914) does not indicate any pre-contact resources within or adjacent to the project. The types of resources recorded by Mills typically represent Woodland-period sites, such as enclosures, mounds, and villages. The burials noted by Mills could be associated with any period, but in general, Mills was probably not recording very many sites associated with pre-Woodland

occupations. Therefore, Mills' atlas has limited utility in assessing the probability of pre-contact sites, although it is useful in understanding the distribution of monumental precontact architecture and major habitation sites.

The Ohio Historic Preservation Office online GIS indicated one previously recorded archaeological site within a portion of the Study Area. LI1085 is an open, non-Aboriginal, Historic site, 251 square meters in size. It is located within the far eastern portion of the Study Area, in association with OHI LIC0126325. It is not adjacent to the LOD.

3.1. PREVIOUS CRM PROJECTS

A review of the SHPO contract CRM reports indicated that several previous studies had included portions of the current project area. Eight studies intersect the Study Area; four of those intersect the Limits of Disturbance (Table 1).

4.1. ARCHITECTURAL RESOURCES

NRHP Historic Districts

The Ohio Historic Preservation Office online GIS indicated three historic districts listed on the NRHP within the Study Area (Table 2). Each of these is adjacent to the LOD, but none are intended to be impacted by the undertaking.

Ohio Historic Inventory Resources

A review of the OHI resources indicated only one resource within the proposed project footprint - the Greyhound Bus Terminal (FRA1039418) at 111 E. Town Street. There are 128 OHIs within the literature review study area (Appendix A). The table in Appendix A indicates OHIs that are adjacent to the Limits of Disturbance with an asterisk.

Determination of Eligibility (DOE) Resources

Some of the OHI files included a SHPO Determination of Eligibility (DOE). A review of those files did not indicate any resources within the proposed project footprint. However, there are 14 DOE resources within the literature review study area (Table 4). While the project's LOD will not physically impact any of these buildings, the lines do encroach on a few of their parcels. Nine of the DOEs are adjacent to the LOD; one of those has been demolished and one has been Listed in the NRHP.

Ohio Genealogical Society Cemetery Resources

A review of OGS cemeteries indicates two within and/or adjacent to the literature review study area. The first (OGSID #5619) is in downtown Columbus and the second (OGSID #8944 and 5915) is at the far east end of the study area (Table 5). The Trinity Episcopal Church Columbarium (OGSID #5619) is adjacent to the Limits of Disturbance while the Glen Rest Memorial Estate (OGSID #8944 and 5915) is not adjacent. Neither of these resources is intended to be impacted by the proposed project.

Historic Bridges

SHPO's GIS data does not indicate any Historic Bridges within the literature review study area. ODOT's TIMS Bridge Inventory shows eight historical resources within the study area (Table 6). These bridges are mainly along E. Main Street, though a few are located downtown. ODOT's internal assessment is that all the historical bridges are Not Eligible for the NRHP.

Historical Map and Aerial Photograph Review

Examination of available historical maps dating to the mid-nineteenth century allows for a reconstruction of landscape history and can identify the potential for historical resources within a project area. Maps from 1883 and 1895, were examined and neither explicitly show historical resources that may still be located within the project area as city and neighborhood blocks are the only drawn depictions; however, these block footprints have remained relatively unchanged despite the metropolitan expansion of Columbus. However, the 1895 map does display notable building locations within the Columbus city limits, like the State Capitol. Both maps display parcel ownership within the project area outside of the Columbus city limits.

Aerial photographs (available online at NETR 2024; Google Earth) show the project area as early as 1953. Within the Columbus city limits, historical aerial photographs depict a high concentration of smaller skyscrapers and older commercial buildings along N. 3rd Street and E. Main Street. Building stock east of modern I-71 was primarily residential and smaller commercial buildings, with a few manufacturing facilities scattered throughout. The concentration of buildings east of Bexley towards Whitehall begins to dwindle to create sporadic pockets of housing developments and fields. Around Rosehill Road within Reynoldsburg, these developments turn into smaller single-family farmhouses with large acreage farmsteads. The 1963 aerial imagery depicts heavy ground disturbance to clear land for modern day I-71. Both Whitehall and Reynoldsburg have undergone development with more residential developments and smaller pockets of fields in these photographs. There are portions of the Study Area that have been demolished and reconstructed over this short period.

By 1980, both I-71 and I-270 were completed, and development along E. Main Street had skyrocketed. Residential and commercial development were prominent along the eastern portion of the Study Area, with only a few small fields interrupting the new housing developments in Whitehall and more rural Reynoldsburg. Building stock in downtown Columbus varied along E. Main Street as large portions of historical-era building stock had been torn down to make way for parking lots and garages. Newer skyscrapers appear noticeably larger than the previous structures surrounding the city. The 1994 aerials depict these same trends, though there appears to be more pockets of ground disturbance and demolition throughout the entire Study Area. Modern aerials show the newer skyscrapers throughout downtown Columbus, and its metropolitan area has stayed relatively the same as the 1980 and 1994 aerials apart from common developments and demolitions seen in other cities and metropolitan areas throughout the state.

The continuous expansion and growth of Columbus and the surrounding metropolitan area along E. Main Street throughout the previous eight decades has significantly altered the historical setting and visual aspects of the remaining historical-era resources, a trend typical within highly urban settings. Despite this, there are many extant residential and commercial buildings that are decipherable on the 1953 aerials. Alterations and expansions were not constrained to the Study Area only – there are many portions just outside of the Study Area that experienced significant alterations apart from the Near East Side Historic District (83004287).

Overall, historical aerial photographs show the project area has been extensively modified through development. While some of the extant historical-era buildings within the project area have been included in the Ohio Historical Inventory (OHI), some of which have SHPO Determinations of Eligibility (DOEs), most surveyed properties lie just outside of the Study Area. As might be expected, a large portion of historical buildings within and just outside of the Study Area in downtown Columbus have been previously inventoried (OHIs) and/or subjected to more intensive survey (DOEs). Several of those have been listed on the NRHP or are within an NRHP Historic District. Outside of the Columbus city limits, there are far fewer previously inventoried resources including OAIs, OHIs, DOEs, and NRHP Listings. Only a few of these resources will have any visibility of the above-ground aspects of the BRT project.

The only areas that are recommended for further study are areas where above ground elements will be added or removed by the project. These include each of the 16 new bus station locations and resources immediately within visual range of those points, along with the parcel of the existing Greyhound Bus Terminal (OHI: FRA1039418) at 111 E. Town Street, which will be demolished by the project. Finally, the location of the proposed terminal building at the eastern end of the project should be examined for archaeological resources in undisturbed context, and the surrounding parcels with historical resources should be assessed for potential visual effects resulting from the new construction.
